

### Westlake Athletic Department Honoree Lawrence Ranallo, U.S. Marine Corps

Lawrence M. Ranallo graduated from Collinwood High School in June of 1964. Marine Corporal Lawrence (Larry) Ranallo became draft eligible on September 19, 1965 and was drafted into the U.S. Marine Corps January 6, 1966.

Larry was trained at Camp Pendleton in California. After 5 months of training, he was sent to Vietnam. Upon arrival, he was assigned to the 7th Engineer Battalion, under the combat engineers of the 1st marine division stationed North of Da Nang. He worked with several construction teams, driving a dump truck, building dirt roads leading to remote outposts, helipads to support those outposts, approach ramps for the pontoon bridges crossing rivers in the field, and driving as the lead vehicles in convoys bringing supplies to the marines up north.

Larry returned home in August 1967 and completed the remainder of the two year service at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina. He was discharged in January of 1968.

Before his departure, David's parents promised him a Torah upon his safe return. A Torah is a handwritten scroll containing all of the Jewish laws and teachings. It is written entirely in Hebrew with a quill. Of the 304, 805 letters that make up the Torah, any mistake makes the Torah unfit to use. This process of writing a Torah can take around a year, making it such a great honor to receive one.

David died in 2017 at 90 years old. He is survived by his wife, three children and 10 grand children which include four Westlake High School alumni and current cheerleading coach, Bianca Beekman.

While there, he served as an 0313 (LAV Crewman) and deployed with SPMAGTF to Haiti in 1994, with the 22nd MEU in 1996, and was meritoriously promoted to both Corporal and Sergeant. During this time, he was accepted to the Marine Corps Enlisted Commissioning Education Program (MECEP).

After returning from deployment, he reported to The Ohio State University to begin duty as a MECEP student. During this time, he was promoted to Staff Sergeant, completed Officer Candidate School, and graduated with a BSBA in Finance.

He was commissioned in September, 1999 and reported for assignment in Quantico. In the spring of 2001 he was assigned to 1st Marine Division, Communication Company where he served as Platoon Commander, Communication Detachment Commander for the Division Forward Command Post, and Operations Officer. During this period, he deployed for Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) I and OIF II. He was eventually promoted to Captain during this tour.

In the summer of 2004, Henton was accepted to the Special Education Program (SEP) and sent to the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) in Monterey, California. While there, Henton received a Master's of Science in Information Technology Management. In the fall of 2006, Henton was assigned to the Marine Corps Tactical Systems Support Activity (MCTSSA) for his SEP payback. While at MCTSSA, he served in the Deployed Support Branch and deployed to Djibouti, Africa; Iraq for OIF-08; and Afghanistan to support SPMAGTF Afghanistan. In June, 2009 he was transferred to 9th Communication Battalion. His first assignment was as Battalion Operations Officer. From January-September, 2010, he deployed to Afghanistan for OEF '10. Following the deployment to Afghanistan, he finished his tour as the Support Company Commander. During this period, he was promoted to his current rank of Major. In the summer of 2011 Major Henton was assigned to the I MEF G-6. In this assignment he served as Deputy, Operations Officer, and as the Assistant Operations Officer.
